The Atlanta Chapter also offers a Sibling Group at the same time as our regular monthly meeting.

The Compassionate Friends, Inc. is a mutual assistance, self-help organization offering friendship, understanding, and hope to bereaved families. Anyone who has experienced the death of a child of any age, from any cause is welcome. Our meetings give parents an opportunity to talk about their child and about their feelings as they go through the grieving process. There is no religious affiliation. There are no membership dues. The purpose of this support group is not to focus on the cause of death or the age of the child, as it is to focus on being a bereaved parent, along with the feelings and issues that evolve around the death experience of a child.

${\cal C}$ andlelight Service Set for Dec. 6 at First Christian Church of Atlanta

The 28th Annual Candlelight Service honoring the memories of our children and siblings will be held on Saturday, Dec. 6, at 7 p.m. at the First Christian Church of Atlanta. The church is located at 4532 LaVista Road in Tucker.

Our speaker that evening will be Elaine Grier, RN, MS, CCRN. Elaine is an assistant professor of adult nursing at Georgia Baptist College of Nursing of Mercer University. She teaches nursing students about the experience of grief throughout their baccalaureate curriculum and has developed a nursing course entitled "Caring in Times of Death, Dying and Bereavement."



Elaine also has a very strong connection with our Atlanta Chapter. For seven years, she served as co-chapter leader of our Atlanta Chapter of TCF. She has spoken locally, nationally and internationally about the experience of parental bereavement and has published many written works about the loss of a child.

Elaine is the mother of four sons: Adam, Philip (deceased), Roman and Sam. She is also the proud "Ya Ya" of baby Jackson Philip Grier, who shares his uncle's name. She lives in the Tucker community.

Her presentation at our Candlelight Service will be "These Things I Know for Sure: Reflections on the Holiday Season."

Our sibling speaker for this year has not been determined yet. Decatur Civic Chorus

We feel honored to announce that about 50 members from the Decatur Civic Chorus, one of the oldest continuing Choral groups in the Southeast, will sing at this year's Candlelight Service. The choir includes Joe Hobbs, one of our chapter's co-leaders.

Civic is in the name of the choir for a reason, as the Chorus is organized to not only bring quality concerts to the public, but to also provide benefit concerts for groups such as The

American Cancer Society, Red Cross, Scottish Rite Childrens' Hospital, etc.

The DCC has been recognized on state, national and international levels. Commended for its service to the State of Georgia by Gov. Zell Miller and the Georgia Senate and House of Representatives, the Chorus also has been recognized by the U.S. House of Representatives. The President of the United States also has praised the Chorus for its gifts of time and talent to the community.

The Chorus has been heard throughout Southeastern U.S. in churches and hospitals, and has appeared in concerts at Disney World, World's Fairs in Knoxville and New Orleans, Spoleto in Charleston, and in the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C. One of the Chorus' concert highlights was appearing with the Mexican National Symphony in the Palace of Fine Arts in Mexico City, Mexico.

The Chorus is a very unique Choral group – not only because of its 60 years of quality concerts, but also because it brings to the community the true sense of volunteerism – the giving of time and talent. Mary Anne Sharp is director and Evelyn Arnn is accompanist.

${\cal G}$ ospel Concert Honors the Memory of Clinton Ron Walker

On Oct. 4 at Greenbriar Mall, some of the top gospel artists from all over the world including as far away as Malaysia, hit the stage to raise funds for The Clinton Ron Walker Scholarship Fund.

Candace Walker says that day was "a culmination of so many things for my family and I." In addition to celebrating the life of her son, the concert raised more than \$1,000 in scholarship money for deserving Georgia students.

She said the event also provided an opportunity "to educate so many of our youth on heart issues and how to keep their hearts healthy. Most importantly, it may save others from the heartache we experienced when we lost Clinton to an undiagnosed heart defect. Through music, fun and education, it is our hope that the youth of Georgia and all who attend will leave knowing what to do to stay healthy and how to apply for one of the most attainable scholarships on the scene."

The Clinton Ron Walker Scholarship Fund Inc. offers students in the Georgia area two monetary scholarships totaling between \$250 and \$1,000 each. Students interested in the scholarships should complete the scholarship application, write a biography about themselves and write a poem or essay on friendship. "Friendship," Candace says, "was one of the most important things to Clinton."

In an e-mail to our TCF Chapter following the concert, Candace wrote:

"The Youth 4 Healthy Hearts Gospel Concert was phenomenal! We had well over 300 people in attendance (in spite of the Sweet Auburn Festival and October Fest going on at the same time. Not to mention Tyler Perry opened his studios only a few blocks away.) Most importantly we raised over \$1,000!

"All the acts were awesome and the ministry flowed from each person. Suffice it to say that if you missed it, you missed one wonderful concert. The highlight for us all was the performance of Patrick Leong's song dedicated in memory of Clinton. His voice is pure beauty and the anointing that flowed from his performance was so powerful that there wasn't a dry eye in the place. I couldn't keep the tears in check and my heart was so full at that moment.

"He sold all of his CD's and we are now pre-ordering them from my church bookstore. If you want one the cost is \$10. Just e-mail me and I will give you more details." (Candace plans to bring the CD to the Oct. 14 TCF meeting to play the song for our chapter.)

"We had a party in every way from James Jackson's 'Thrilling' performance to Canton's war cry. My personal peeps...Carmen Bonner, Regina Jimison and Joseph Westbrook opened things up and it was so good to see them up front and center for a change! I had never heard Platinum Souls perform before but they were hot! I plan to have them at my church for a youth concert real soon! I will keep you posted on how that turns out!

"For those of you who missed it...no worries we have pictures and plan to create a DVD of the event for purchase. (Always looking for ways to add to that scholarship money)

"Finally we are taking orders for the Youth 4 Healthy Hearts T-shirts. Let me know if you want one...they are \$10 and for each purchase we will give you a gift...while supplies last. Again, e-mail me and we will work it out."

It will be my one and only rose from my son Billy, the LOVE & PEACE rose.
