Registration Opens for TCF National Conference in Portland, Ore.

Registration has begun for the 2009 National Conference of The Compassionate Friends, to be held Aug. 7-9 at the Doubletree Hotel Lloyd Center in Portland, Ore.

Keynote speakers are:

- Candy Lightner, whose daughter was killed by an impaired driver. She founded Mothers Against Drunk Drivers (MADD).
- Reg and Maggie Green, whose son Nicholas died at the hands of highway bandits in Italy. The donation of Nicholas' organs, which saved seven people in a country nearly devoid of organ donors, spurred thousands to give the gift of life in what became the subject of a Hallmark Hall of Fame movie, "Nicholas' Gift."
- Darcie Sims, who uses her own unique brand of humor as a special type of grief therapy, is a bereaved parent, nationally-certified grief management specialist, psychotherapist and a board-certified hypnotherapist.
- Michele Longo Eder is the author of "Salt in our Blood – The memoir of a Fisherman's Wife." An accomplished lawyer, Michele started journaling while her husband and sons were off commercial fishing never dreaming her journaling would include the account of a personal tragedy that struck just before Christmas 2001.

On Friday evening (Aug. 7), there will be a special performance of the 2006 Pulitzer Prize-winning drama "Rabbit Hole." Written by David Linday-Abaire, it is a bittersweet, funny and refreshingly honest look at tragedy and the healing power of family.

To allow everyone to be a part of the 2009 conference (even if it's not possible for you to attend), the conference committee will decorate the conference area with "Frames of Love" – pictures of TCF children being remembered.

For a nominal charge (to help defray conference costs), pictures sent in of TCF children will be placed in the special frames. For more information about submitting a picture, go to the TCF national Web site at www.compassionatefriends.org.

Candlelight Service Set for Dec. 5

And, please think about stepping forward to chair one of the sub-committees charged with organizing this year's program. Sub-committee chairs are needed for the following:

- Reception. This includes coming at 2 p.m. to set-up the Fellowship Hall, overseeing the evening reception and coordinating clean-up. (The church custodian will vacuum and re-set the room and you'll have lots of help.)
- Creating centerpieces for our reception. We need someone creative to design and oversee the creation of this year's centerpieces.

- Conference speakers. After the planning committee
 determines the selection of speakers, this person will
 contact the speakers to extend the invitation to speak,
 request biographical information and photos for the
 newsletter, and provide them with information about
 the Candlelight Service.
- Music. This person will oversee a committee charged with selecting music for the program. This person also will be responsible for writing to the company that holds the copyright to the music to request permission to print the lyrics in our program.

Chapter Members Invited to Local Film Screening of 'Motherland'

On April 22, a film called "Motherland" will be presented at the Atlanta Film Festival about six grieving women from diverse backgrounds who made a 17-day intensive pilgrimage to volunteer in rural South Africa.

The film's Web site notes: "Prior to the journey, these six women did not know each other. However they all shared one thing in common: they had all suffered the death of a child. With grief in their hearts and the willingness to make a difference, this intrepid group of women traveled half way around the world to live with local African families and to work with African organizations dedicated to improving the lives of children."

This documentary film reveals what happened, and the lives that were forever changed, on this journey of hope and healing.

The Web site goes on to say: "By illuminating the overwhelming pain and isolation caused by the loss of a loved one, 'Motherland' opens up an honest and intimate dialogue about the complexity of grief. Through the different voices and experiences of this diverse group of women, we are reminded that there is no instruction manual for dealing with grief, and that there is no 'right way' to grieve. The film explores the differences between the American women's experience of suffering and that of the African women they meet along their journey, and in

doing so, it challenges our culture's inadequacy for dealing with death and loss. Through the relationships and friendships that form between this unlikely group of travelers, we are reminded of the resilience and triumph of the human spirit. The film ultimately celebrates these mothers' ability to survive, to heal and to live again.

"In addition, 'Motherland' examines the healing potential of volunteering and being of service to others. It sheds light on current issues affecting women and children in Africa, and the rest of the world. It addresses the complexities of poverty and race relations, both in Africa and America, as well as the universal experience of human grief and suffering within a global context. The larger vision of the filmmaker is to offer an opportunity for healing, growth and hope, not only to the women and children of the film, but to the entire global community."

Jennifer Steinman, who directed the film said: "The idea for the film came from two sources of inspiration. First, I was deeply affected when my dear friend Barbara, who is one of the women in the film, lost her son Jason in a car accident several years ago. I watched her through her many stages of grief, as she had to bear the unimaginable pain of every parent's worst nightmare. I knew there had to be other mothers out there suffering from similar experiences, and I wanted to find a way to bring them together.

"Then, in the summer of 2006, I was reading a book by Stephen Lewis, the UN Secretary General's special envoy for HIV/AIDS in Africa, called 'Race against Time.' In his book, he details the devastation occurring throughout Africa today because of the AIDS epidemic and extreme poverty."

She said, "I was so deeply moved by the notion of 'a nation of mourners,' that I was motivated to want to do something – anything – to help the world heal. The result is this film project. It is inspired by my desire to address the com-plexities of the universal experience of grief, and to contribute some healing to our planet at a time when the world needs it most."

Mother's Day...Father's Day...graduations...vacations... these are special family times which often catch us unaware and bring unexpected tears and painful memories of young lives cut short. It does get better! And you can make these special days better with some planning and with encouragement from those who have already been there.

Whatever the "special day" that lies ahead for your family, try to focus on doing something meaningful and tangible in remembrance of your child. Share as a family thoughts and suggestions about planting a tree or starting a rose garden, donating a book to the library or school, putting flowers on the altar, lighting a special candle or taking that long talked-of vacation. Tears and moments of sadness are okay, for they are expressions of love.

Remember:

- Take one day at a time.
- Keep things simple by playing down the holidays and special days, while they are so painful.
- Change your routine from past years.
- Make plans to be "busy" during at least part of the day (go out to lunch or to a movie, or visit friends)
- Give your older children some "space." They not only feel your extreme sadness at these times; they also have their own feelings to deal with.


The anticipation is often worse than the day itself!
